# **Media arrangements**

#### Media pass

Included in this pack is a media pass wristband. This must be worn at all times for access into and around the Guildhall. If you cannot show security your wristband, you will be refused entry to the Guildhall.

Please also bring photo ID with you as security may ask to see it.

# Timing

Please arrive at the Guildhall (Guildhall Street entrance) between 21:30 and 22:00. Security officers will be manning the doors and you will only be allowed in if you have your media pass wristband with you.

Please make your way to the large hall balcony on the second floor where you'll be met by Melanie Butcher and Ashley Perry.

The Guildhall will close 30 minutes after the final local election result has been announced. Please ensure you vacate the building promptly after the elections.

# Parking

The Grand Arcade is the closest car park to the Guildhall. The postcode for this car park is CB2 3QJ. Parking charges are available on the council website cambridge.gov.uk

# Media facilities

#### Large hall balcony

The large hall balcony will be the base for all media. The members' room on the first floor will also be available, with a TV.

#### Refreshments

The Green Coffee Company will be open during Thursday night and will be serving hot drinks and food. The cafe is on the ground floor on the Peas Hill side of the Guildhall.

#### Toilets

Toilets will be signposted but are on the ground floor near the Guildhall Street entrance.

#### Smoking

There is no smoking in the Guildhall.

#### **Fire procedure**

In the event of a fire alarm being activated, you must leave the Guildhall immediately through the nearest usable exit – please familiarise yourself with the escape routes which will be highlighted on posters around the balcony area.

Please congregate at the junction of Great St Mary's Passage and King's Parade so we can check against the attendance list that everyone has been accounted for.

### Equipment

Any technical requirements need to be discussed with Jim Stocker in advance and he will try to accommodate your requirements. It may be possible for you to set up in the large hall balcony on Wednesday 2 May. The large hall balcony will be locked but we can take no responsibility for loss or damage of any equipment.

# Attendance at the count

The Representation of the People Act 1983, requires that those attending the count maintain the secrecy of the ballot process and do not obstruct the count. This means you are not allowed to film or photograph individual ballot papers showing how an individual has voted. You are also not allowed to communicate results from the count until they have been announced by the returning officer.

#### Filming and photography

Melanie and Ashley will escort you to the count floor before the counting begins to photograph or film some of the early ballot boxes being up-ended on the count desks. You will have a short time to take more photographs and to film. You will then be escorted from the count floor back to the balcony area.

# The returning officer has given strict instructions that media representatives will not be able to enter the count floor at any other time during the count.

Photography and filming is permitted elsewhere in the Guildhall including from the balcony area.

Any unauthorised access to the count floor will result in security being notified and individuals being asked to leave the Guildhall.

#### Interviews

If you'd like to interview candidates please let Melanie or Ashley know on the night. They will ask the candidate if they are happy to be interviewed. If they are, the interview will take place on the large hall balcony or in a corridor or office.

Party agents may be able to arrange interviews with their candidates in advance. Agent details are in the sections that follow.

# The election process

### **Polling stations**

Forty-three polling stations throughout Cambridge will be open from 07:00 until 22:00.

# **Ballot boxes**

Immediately after the polls close, the presiding officer from each station will return the sealed ballot boxes to the Guildhall. Separate arrangements are made for verifying postal votes, including those handed in at polling stations. All postal vote ballot papers are added to those from the ballot boxes to be counted.

# Verifying and counting ballots

There are two stages to the count. Stage one is where the counters verify that all ballot boxes hold the correct number of ballot papers. Stage two is when the ballot papers are sorted into candidate votes.

The verification and then the count of local election ballots will begin at approximately 22:15.

# Results

Results will be announced as they are verified throughout the night. The final result is expected around 03:00 on Friday 4 May. If a recount of any ward is called, the result for that ward will be delayed. Antoinette Jackson, returning officer and Cambridge City Council chief executive, will announce the results.

#### 2003 city council election results

The Liberal Democrats took 40% of the vote, Labour 27%, the Conservatives 22% and the Green Party 9%. The UK Independence Party and Socialist Alliance polled below 1% each.

# Legalities

# Representation Of The People Act, 1983 SECTION 66, SUBSECTIONS 2 AND 6

[...]

(2) Every person attending at the counting of the votes shall maintain and aid in maintaining the secrecy of voting and shall not –

ascertain or attempt to ascertain at the counting of the votes the number or other unique identifying mark on the back of any ballot paper; communicate any information obtained at the counting of the votes as to the candidate for whom any vote is given on a particular ballot paper.

[...]

6) If a person acts in contravention of this section he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months.
